From the Pastor

November 19 is WORLD TOILET DAY! Yes, it's a real thing! When nature calls, take action!

Wherever you are, and whatever you do on November 19, make it all about toilets.

Give thanks if you have one! One that's inside! One that flushes! That has a lid! And a door for privacy! PLUS a roll of soft toilet paper beside it! Rejoice if you have more than one! Become aware, and grateful, for all the toilets available to you: at Home Depot and Subway and in the mall and at McDonald's and at the movies and Costco and WalMart and the gas station and school and church...we are blessed with an abundance of clean, safe, accessible toilets. Access to a safe functioning toilet has a positive impact on public health, human dignity, and personal safety, especially for women. The global sanitation crisis is reflected in the following facts, according to reports from the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF):

- 900 million schoolchildren across the world have no handwashing facilities a critical barrier in the spread of deadly diseases.
- One third of schools worldwide do not provide any toilet facilities a particular problem for girls during menstruation.
- Around 60% of the global population 4.5 billion people either have no toilet at home or one that doesn't safely manage excreta.
- 862 million people worldwide still practice open defecation this means human feces, on a massive scale, is not being captured or treated.
- 1.8 billion people use an unimproved source of drinking water with no protection against contamination from feces.
- Globally, 80% of the wastewater generated by society flows back into the ecosystem without being treated or reused.

What can we do? How can we respond?

- Pray
- Become more aware through websites like <u>www.worldtoiletday.info</u> and worldtoilet.org
- Watch "Toilet: Ek Prem Katha (A Love Story) on Netflix to explore cultural barriers to indoor toilets
- Contribute to ELCA Good Gifts for drop latrine toilets
- Contribute to World Toilet Organization
- Pay attention to how many times a day you use a toilet; don't take it for granted, be thankful.
