## **LITANY OF LAMENT FOR ALL SAINTS IN A TIME OF PANDEMIC**

This year as we celebrate All Saints Day, the shroud of death covers us. 700,000 and more have died in our nation from the COVID-19 pandemic. Four and a half million and more have died worldwide.

**Have mercy, O God.**

Sickness fills our homes and hospitals. Health care workers are weary and exhausted. Like Mary in the Gospel we cry out, "Lord, if you had been here!" Over 100,000 children in the United States cry out for parents, grandparents, or caregivers who have died from this pandemic.

**Have mercy, O God.**

As we mourn those who have died, we also grieve the loss of usual ways of living. Some relationships are strained or broken. Depression, anxiety, fear, and grief trouble our hearts.

**Have mercy, O God.**

Receive O God, the laments of our own hearts...

*A time for silence.*

Even as we grieve, we do not grieve as those without hope. We trust in the promise of resurrection and the hope of new life in Christ.

We lift up to You, O God, the names of those we have lost in this past year from our lives, knowing that they are with your heart forever. *As we read these names, we will pause after every name to remember, pray, and give thanks for their life.*

**Saints of God, we remember you, and we honor you. You will not be forgotten.**

Lift up your heads and hear these words of promise:

The Creator of all brings life from the ashes.

The Redeemer of the world wipes away our tears.

The Spirit of life fills us with strength for the days to come.




