From the Pastor

Brothers and Sisters  
in Christ,

"<sup>24</sup>He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; <sup>25</sup>but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. <sup>26</sup>So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. <sup>27</sup>And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' <sup>28</sup>He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' <sup>29</sup>But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. <sup>30</sup>Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'" <sup>36</sup>Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him,

saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." <sup>37</sup> He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; <sup>38</sup> the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, <sup>39</sup> and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. <sup>40</sup> Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. <sup>41</sup> The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, <sup>42</sup> and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>43</sup> Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!" -Matthew 13:24–30, 36–43

This is one of those passages that bothers me a lot and I constantly find myself going back and looking at it, because there are many different ways to look at it. In our Gospel lesson, God promises us that, in the end, those who are evil will be separated from those who are good. As human beings, we should recognize our limited abilities in perceiving the entirety of a person, for while we may be able to set up laws to punish people for their actions, it is not our place to judge another person as evil: we can only see their actions, not the entire person and trust that in the end, just as the Gospel says, those who are truly evil will be judged, just as those who are not will be judged as well. In the meantime, the only thing we can control is ourselves and how we interact with the world around us, and we are called to interact with that world in a positive way.

### FAMILY PROMISE

**Family Promise of Metro East** helps children and their families experiencing houselessness achieve sustainable independence through a community-based response. This program is the evolved version of DayBreak. They operate a Day Center, where they provide access to case management, showers, laundry, phones, mail, and a place to relax. Between 13 host congregations, they host overnight (6pm-7am) hospitality for one week every quarter on a rotational basis. Those 13 hosts are then supported by 26 congregations with volunteers and financial backing. There are some fliers in the office for you to read that go into more detail. Let's get the conversation rolling in church if you believe this is something that we should be supporting!

The **Community Resource Fair** we're hosting on August 21<sup>st</sup> coincides with the City of Portland's **Sunday Parkways** event. This event draws thousands of cyclists, and this year is the first year the city has planned a route in our part of Southeast Portland!

2022 May sale: \$17,408.44


Christmas Sale: \$479.50

## Preparing for Shipment of Quilts and School Kits to Lutheran World Relief in October

Our quilters are busy sewing and assembling quilts. Such a long history of sharing their talents and time with others both locally and across the world.

There will be a depot in early October to ship donated quilts from Gethsemane to Lutheran World Relief.

In addition to sharing these quilts, we have used the fall shipment to donate school kits. The donated school supplies are put into a drawstring backpack. We have approximately 200 backpacks sewn and ready to be filled. We will need to have the drawstring bags threaded with macrame cord. This can be a tedious job, but we have plans to have this done as one of the "God's Work Our Hands" projects this year.

Back-to-School sales are happening right now. This is the best time to purchase supplies. Watch those ads and you can snag some great deals on the needed supplies. We can use all of the supplies listed below for the kits. However, one of the biggest needs is the spiral notebooks, as we place four of the notebooks in each kit. Donated supplies can be placed in the LWR tub in the narthex.

**Needed supplies for the kits: (1 of each per kit unless otherwise noted)**

- ***Spiral Notebooks: 70-80 Sheets, 8" by 10 ½", either college or wide-ruled (4 in each kit)***
- ***Rulers: 30-centimeter, or rulers with centimeter on one side and inches on the other***
- ***Pencil Sharpeners: hand-held***
- ***Scissors: blunt (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)***
- ***Pens: black or blue ballpoint (no gel ink) (5 in each kit)***
- ***Erasers: 2 ½"***
- ***Crayons: 16 or 24-count box***
- ***Pencils: unsharpened #2 with erasers (5 in each kit)***

- \* If you use the tables in the Community Hall, please wipe them off when you're done so they're clean for the next folks.
- \* Do you know someone in need of food pantry resources? **Oregon Food Bank's "Food Finder"** ([foodfinder.oregonfoodbank.org](http://foodfinder.oregonfoodbank.org)) can help! Enter an address to find all the free local pantries within 15 miles, including open days and hours.
- \* **SnowCap's summer needs** include the following: baby formula, hearty canned soup / chili / stews, gallon zip-top bags, canned fruits & vegetables, canned tuna, children's pants in kids sizes 6x-14, new socks (all sizes), new underwear (all sizes), gently-used shoes labeled with size on the toe with tape (this helps so much!), cans & bottles with deposit (rinsed please!) **“Our Lady of Ferguson and All Those Killed by Gun Violence.”**

Here, Mary is depicted as a Black woman with her hands up. Within her womb is a small black silhouette of Jesus in a similar posture, but in the crosshairs of a gun. The posture, a clear reference to the “Hands up, don’t shoot” slogan birthed in Ferguson, Mo. in response to the murders of Michael Brown and Freddie Gray at the hands of police officers, is also the “*orans*” position of prayer. *Orans*, which in Latin means “praying,” is a position that designates pleading or supplication to God. *Orans* is also referred to as “lifting up holy hands”.


## Vanco Contributions Procedure Option Two
